## End of the Day Jar

The End of the Day Jar is a great way to finish up the day with community circle. Have students join you at your group space. You can pull out a card or have a student read the card. There are several ways to respond. You can call on students, have the student that chose the card respond or have students buddy talk and share.

Instructions:

Print and laminate cards and label. Add the cards to any type of jar. Tape the label to the front of the jar. I included a blank sheet if you would like to add your own questions.

What is one thing you learned today?

Did you do something kind for someone else today?

What was the hardest thing you had to do today?

Did any of your classmates do anything funny?

Tell about something you read today.

Who did you play with at recess? What did you play?

Is there anything your teacher could have done differently today?

Who did you sit with at lunch today?

What was your favorite part of school today?

What happened today that you would have liked to have gone differently?

What did you do in your special class (art, PE, music, library) today? Name an adjective that would describe your day.

Did anyone do something nice for you today? What are your goals for tomorrow?

Did you give your best effort on your work today? Why or why not? Share something about your day.


Did your teacher get upset today? Why and what could the class have done differently? What are you looking forward to tomorrow?
